IMPORTANT NOTICE TO DOG OWNERS

If you own a dog and do not buy a license, you could be placed on a delinquent dog license list and the delinquent dog license tax can be collected in the same manner as personal property taxes. The **only** exception for not buying a dog license is if the dog is kept for educational or scientific purposes. Dogs specially trained to lead blind or deaf persons or to provide support for mobility-impaired persons can obtain a free dog license.

For your information, all dog license fees are deposited into a dog license fund. After deducting expenses for forms and license tags and retaining \$1,000 by Douglas County for payment of potential dog damage claims, the balance of the fund is given to the Humane Society of Douglas County. By purchasing a dog license you are not only protecting your pet in the event it should become lost, you are supporting your local animal shelter. Only 9% of the dogs in Douglas County are licensed. This is a significantly low number in comparison to other counties.

Be a responsible dog owner and buy a license, it's the law. See section 174.05 of the Wisconsin Statutes for dog licensing and section 95.21 (2)(a) for dog vaccination requirements.
