## **VOTING BY ABSENTEE BALLOT – REVISED OCTOBER 6, 2016**

(REVISIONS IN RED AND ITALICIZED)

Any qualified elector who is unable or unwilling to appear at the polling place on Election Day may request to vote an absentee ballot. A qualified elector is any U.S. citizen, who will be 18 years of age or older on Election Day, who has resided in the ward or municipality where he or she wishes to vote for at least 10 consecutive days before the election. The elector must also be registered in order to receive an absentee ballot. Proof of identification must be provided before an absentee ballot may be issued.

## You must make a request for an absentee ballot in writing.

Contact your municipal clerk and request that an application for an absentee ballot be sent to you, or download the form from <a href="www.gab.wi.gov">www.gab.wi.gov</a> (search for application for absentee ballot or EL-121). You may also submit a written request in the form of a letter. Your written request must list your voting address within the municipality where you wish to vote, the address where the absentee ballot should be sent, if different, and your signature. You may make application for an absentee ballot by mail, email or in person.

## Making application to receive an absentee ballot by mail

### The deadline for making application to receive an absentee ballot by mail is:

5 pm on the fifth day before the election, Thursday, November 3, 2016; however, with our mail turnaround time and scheduled clerk hours two days a week, it's best to make your request by October 27, 2016.

**Note**: Special absentee voting application provisions apply to electors who are indefinitely confined to home or a care facility, in the military, hospitalized, or serving as a sequestered juror. If this applies to you, contact the municipal clerk regarding deadlines for requesting and submitting an absentee ballot.

#### **Voting an absentee ballot in person – NEW AND IMPORTANT!**

Recent legislation now allows for a longer in-person absentee voting period. You may request and vote an absentee ballot in the clerk's office during the days and hours specified for casting an absentee ballot in person.
